If so, the UMRDC Revolving Loan Fund may be able to fill that financing gap. Eligible start-up and expansion projects include the financing of equipment, real estate, and working capital.

What you need to know about the RLF:

- RLF funds should be used to create or retain jobs in the 5 County region
- Bank financing is required as RLF can only be used to fill that gap
- 10% owner equity is required
- RLF funds cannot be used to finance construction
- All types of business start-ups or expansions are eligible for application with priority given to businesses involved in manufacturing, technology, and/or diversification of the local economy

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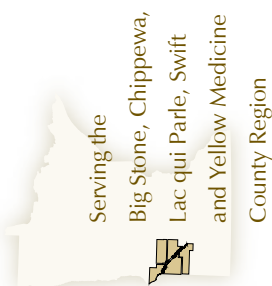

2015 Meander Art Crawl SUCCESS!

The 2015 Meander Art Crawl had another outstanding year and the survey results can prove it! The UMRDC tallied the reports from 40 different artists to find that more than \$99,000 of art was purchased over the three day Meander weekend.

According to surveys returned by Meander visitors and the artists themselves, the average Meander customer also spends \$29 on food and gas and \$11 on shopping other than art in the region. When multiplied by the estimated 2000 Meanderers who took part in the weekend, it is projected that another \$80,000 flowed into the small towns of the 5 County region (Big Stone, Swift, Chippewa, Lac qui Parle and Yellow Medicine) served by the UMRDC. The Meander Art Crawl not only highlights the artist's studios and introduces people to our region, but it is a huge economic boost for small businesses within our region.

UMVRDC Helps Author a Successful \$4.95 Million Grant!

UMVRDC staff authored a second successful Border to Border grant application to DEED for Federated Telephone. UMVRDC staff continue to hone their grant writing skills and broadband knowledge while quickly becoming the go-to in the region for broadband questions, case study inquiries or help connecting with professionals in the broadband industry.

This year's grant of \$4,950,000 will allow Federated to deploy fiber to the eastern portions of Swift County and a small area in and around the City of Appleton. Last year Federated was awarded \$3.9M to deliver fiber in the northern portion of Big Stone County. These projects will provide connectivity to areas in Big Stone and Swift Counties that were previously identified as unserved by the Minnesota Office of Broadband expanding the region's fiber footprint significantly. High speed fiber broadband will help raise the bar on rural economic development allowing residents and businesses in these areas to compete and prosper in the global economy.

The UMVRDC continues to discuss broadband with a number of communities throughout the region. The City of Madison has recently contracted with the UMVRDC to explore the needs and community interest in high speed broadband options. The outcome of this project will help determine the demand and feasibility of bringing in high speed broadband to Madison. Appleton is also working on a similar project.

Minnesota Office of Broadband announcement:

The project will deliver high-speed Internet service to 600 households, 425 businesses and 75 community institutions. The project area includes De Graff, Swift Falls and rural parts

of eastern Swift County. The project touches 13 of the County's 21 townships. Total project costs are \$12.5 million. The remaining \$7.5 million (60 percent local match) will be covered by a loan from Swift County to Federated. The project will help support community and economic development through job creation, business expansion and newly possibly business start-up opportunities. More than 500 jobs are expected to be created over the next few years, related to farming, home-based startups, commercial expansions and more. Nearly half of the County's 800 farms are in the project area.

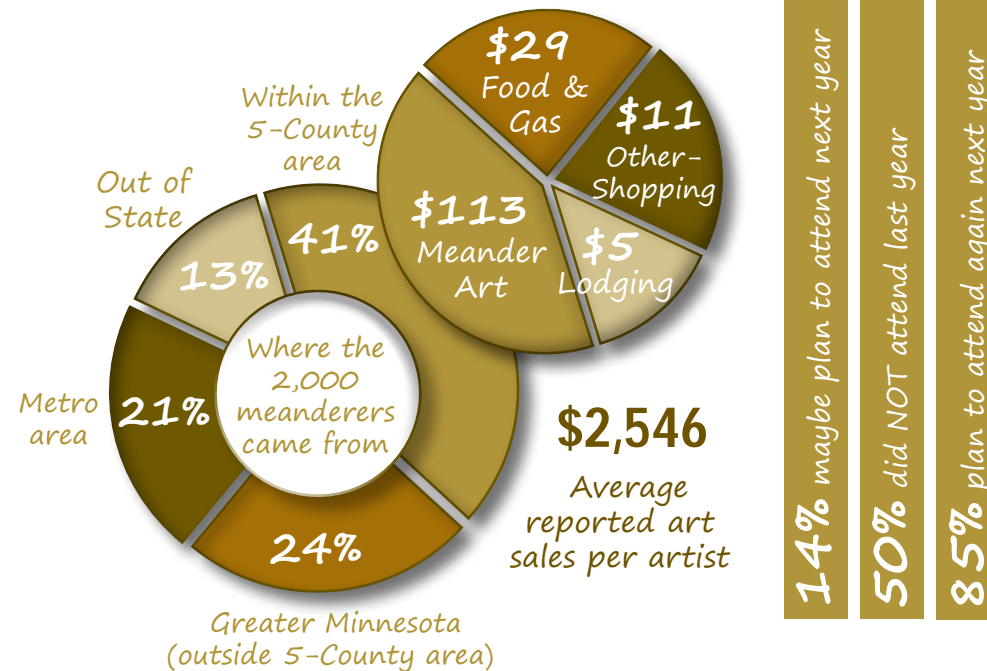
Meander's Economic Impact

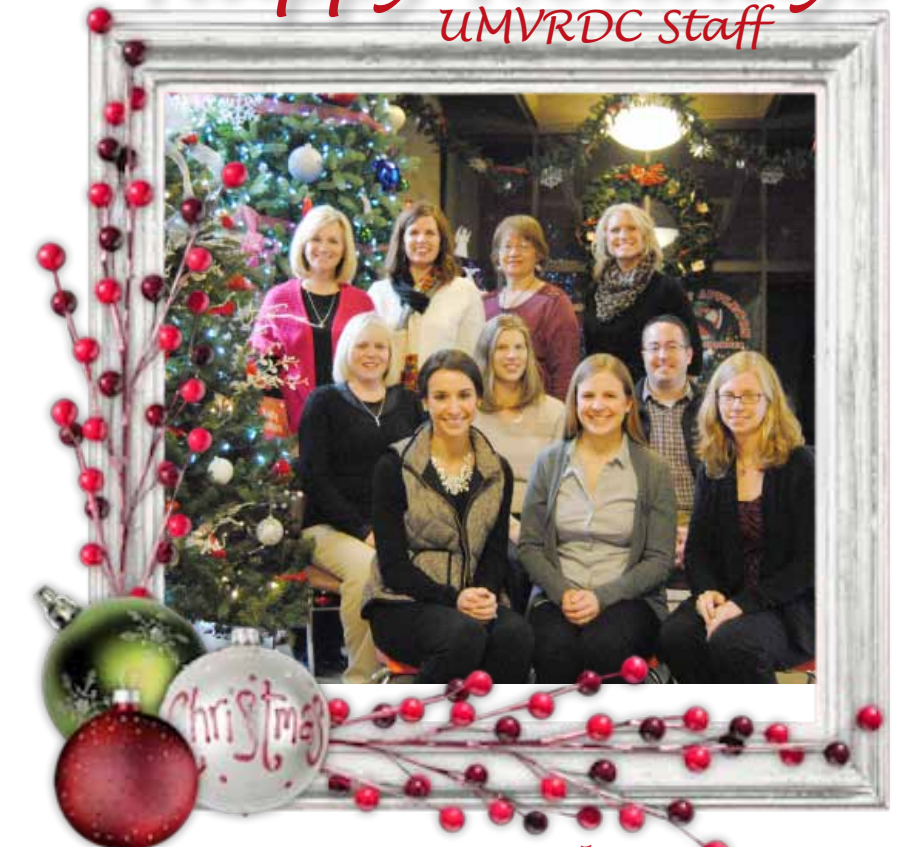
