
At \$86,900, the median home value in Kerkhoven is below that of both Swift County and the state of Minnesota, however it is the highest compared to similar sized communities in the Region. Median monthly housing costs for homeowners, however falls in the middle when compared to other similar sized communities, but remains lower than both the county and the state. The median rent in Kerkhoven, on the other hand, is the lowest compared to

similar sized communities.

Home ownership vacancy rate and rental vacancy rate are the proportion of the homeowner or rental inventory that is vacant "for sale" or vacant "for rent." The overall vacancy rate includes other vacancies such as vacant "sold – not occupied," seasonal housing and vacant "rented - not occupied." In 2010, the city of Kerkhoven had a lower overall and rental vacancy rate compared to similar sized communities but a slightly higher home ownership vacancy rate than most.





Kerkhoven Population Distribution, 2010



The above population distribution above shows that there is a large percentage of the population in the middle aged and 10 and under age cohorts, which is uncommon for communities in the Region as many have aging populations. Kerkhoven is more diverse than other communities in the region with over 12% of the population being non-white. This diversity may explain the higher percentages of youth in the population.

Kerkhoven has seen an overall increase in population of nearly 18 percent from 1960-2010. Kerkhoven is one of only a handful of communities in the Region that has experienced a positive overall growth rate since 1960. However, the population held steady with no growth from 2000 to 2010 and is projected to decrease over the next few decades.



The employment categories shown in the table above and chart below show the 11 Super Sectors of Industry, which is the federal standard in data pertaining to business and industry. Much of the employment and economic activity in Kerkhoven is in the Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, and the Education and Health Services sectors. The pie chart below details that in Swift County, about half of all employment comes from Education and Health Services, and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities. Swift County had a slight increase in unemployment during the Recession of 2007-2009, but in 2011 had an unemployment rate under 7.5%.
